FROM CAFE ASSISTANT TO CAFE OWNER: HEART-WARMING STORY OF BUSINESS ACCELERATION SUPPORTED BY INYOSI EMPOWERMENT

Khwezi Yamaphi's story is the epitome of resilience and dedication.

After suffering one of the biggest setbacks in 2019, he was more determined than ever to pick up the pieces and forge ahead.

For Khwezi, proud owner of two Silulo Ulutho Technologies ("Silulo") franchises, this setback meant starting from scratch.

Khwezi's internet café and computer training facilities were looted and vandalized during service delivery protests in Nomzamo, a small township just outside Strand in Cape Town.

At the time, Khwezi found that looters had stolen computers and other operating equipment before vandalizing his facility and leaving it in what he could only describe as a "terrifying state" What was once a vibrant, SETA-accredited facility, providing internet access and computer training to the residents of Nomzamo was now a distant memory.

The facility suffered an even heavier blow when the looters returned the next day and robbed them of the remaining computers and equipment at gunpoint, leaving Khwezi and his staff with no hope of getting the business on its feet again.

This loss crippled his business as he lacked funds to replace the stolen equipment, some of which were not insured at the time.

Khwezi's journey with Inyosi Empowerment had started in 2017 when he applied for loan funding to acquire his business after being introduced to Inyosi Empowerment by Silulo's executives.

His application was successful, and Inyosi Finance NPC provided a loan to Khwezi's company Funda Solutions (Pty) Ltd.

After the store was looted Khwezi's first call was to Inyosi Empowerment, who had provided him with business loan funding in order to acquire 100% ownership of his Silulo Franchises.

Inyosi provided Khwezi with grant funding to replace the stolen computers and suspended interest and payments on his outstanding loan until his premises were repaired and in operation.

"Inyosi has been good to me. In fact, there was never a time where I was in need, and they did not come through for me.

I will forever be grateful," Khwezi said. Due to the high demand for ICT services in the Nomzamo area, Khwezi's business has grown exponentially.

"Inyosi assisted me in obtaining 100% ownership of both stores. For me, the fact that I could be granted credit and at such low interest rates is a very big thing.

I cannot think of any bank or money lending organisation that could grant credit at such low interest rates," Khwezi concluded.

CALM' PROTEAS DOWN INDIA IN RAIN-HIT 1ST ODI

Heinrich Klaasen and David Miller hit unbeaten half-centuries to set up a nine-run win for South Africa in a rain-reduced opening one-day international against India on Thursday.

The left-handed Miller (75) and Klaasen (74) put on an unbeaten stand of 139 runs after the tourists lost their top four in the 40-overs-a-side match in Lucknow.

The bowlers, led by Kagiso Rabada, then kept India down to 240-8 despite Sanju Samson's unbeaten 86 off 63 balls as South Africa took a 1-0 lead in the three-match series.

"A good fight at the end, obviously Sanju pushed us, but the boys stood firm and took us to the win," skipper Temba Bavuma said after the win.

The Proteas keep themselves in the hunt for a direct entry into next year's 50-over World Cup with crucial Super League points on offer for the 11th-ranked side.

The top eight teams (seven and hosts India) get a direct qualification to the league stages of the 2023 World Cup.



THE SOUTH AFRICAN COUNCIL ON SPORT TURNS 50

The South African Council on Sport will celebrate their 50th anniversary next year.

This event will be celebrate country wide and in each province where non-racial sport under Sacos were played.

The theme will be The sacrifices of the sport people in Apartheid under Sacos, the only non-racial sport body in the world.

A steering committee was established in Wellington by delegate of Boland and Western Cape.

A program will be drawn up at the end of October in Johannesburg.

This conference will be held in Boston. The Refressing of Sacos and the road ahead will also be discuss.

It was very clear in this meeting that Sacos is eager to uplift community sport who has died amongst disadvantage communities. Alternative structures will be put in place.

A meeting with one of the only two living presidents, Frank van der Horst took place on 18th October in Cape Town for his blessings and inputs as and guest speaker at next year's festival.
